Minutes of the Annual General Body Meeting of All India Chess Federation held at 1230 hrs on Saturday, 11.06.2022 at Hotel Tamil Nadu, Tamil Nadu Tourism Development Corporation Beach Resort, Mahabalipuram, Chennai and transacted the following Agenda:

Dr. Sanjay Kapoor, President of the Federation chaired the meeting.

Before beginning the meeting, the house congratulated and gave a standing ovation to Shri Bharat Singh Chauhan, Secretary of All India Chess Federation for his swift action for bringing the 44th FIDE Chess Olympiad to India as well as quickly finding resources through Government of Tamil Nadu to host the Olympiad at Chennai.

The Secretary brought to the attention the discussions and deliberations conducted in the meeting of the Central Council held at 11:30 AM and also reiterated the deliberations which took place in the Urgent Special Meeting of the General Body at 12:00 Noon.

AGENDA 1:

DECISION:

The members unanimously approved the minutes of the Annual General Body Meeting held on 10/06/2021 at New Delhi, Special General Body Meeting held on 04.04.2022 through online Zoom and Urgent General Body Meeting held on 10.05.2022 through online Zoom platform.

DECISION:

The Secretary intimated the house that the proposal of Central Council to amend the constitution to comply with the National Sports Code was approved by the Urgent Special General Body Meeting held on date.

AGENDA 8:

National Women Chess Championship Prize money structure should be equal to National Senior Chess Championship (30 Lacs) – To discuss & decide

DECISION:

The proposal of Secretary to make the prize money of National Women Chess Championship to be equal with National Senior Chess Championship (30 Lacs) was unanimously agreed by the house.

AGENDA 9:

All the GM Event prize money should be minimum of 20 lacs for minimum one category – To discuss & decide

DECISION:

The Secretary intimated the house that there is no regulation for the minimum prize money for International Grandmaster Norm tournament and proposed to have at least Rs. 20 Lacs prize money for the GM Category event. After due deliberation the house agreed to make the minimum Rs. 20 Lacs prize money for the GM Category event.

AGENDA 10:

Progress of preparation: 44th FIDE Chess Olympiad – To discuss & decide

DECISION:

The Secretary intimated the house that the preparation for the 44th FIDE Chess Olympiad is in full swing and progressing as expected. The Olympiad planning committee member Shri AK Verma explained the house about the progress through a power point presentation. The entire house applauded for the Secretary's mammoth effort.

Decision:

The Secretary intimated that hosting the Olympiad is huge task and various committees have to be formed for the same. He read out all the names of various committees and house unanimously approved the names and assured full cooperation and support for the successful conduct of the Olympiad.

AGENDA 12: Creation of FIDE Chess Academy - To discuss & decide

The Secretary intimated the house that game of chess is a spreading it's wing to all nook and corner of the country and proposed to have FIDE Chess Academies as per FIDE Trainer Commission regulations. The house unanimously approved for the creation of FIDE Chess Academy in the country and authorised Secretary to work out the modalities.

AGENDA 13: Resignation of IM Dinesh Sharma as Selection Committee Member and nomination of IM NK Mishra as replacement – To discuss and decide

Decision:

The secretary intimated the house that International Master Dinesh Sharma has submitted his resignation on personal grounds as he is still an active player. Name of International Master Neeraj Kumar Mishra was proposed as the replacement. The house unanimously accepted the resignation of IM Dinesh Sharma as well as nomination of IM NK Mishra as the Selection Committee Member.

AGENDA 14: Pending Court Cases- To discuss & decide.

Decision:.

The Secretary informed the house that many court cases are pending at various courts in India especially at Chennai, Kolkata and Delhi as well as more cases are being filed to derail the progress of CHESS in INDIA. He also intimated the house that in case any important

development happens in court cases, the same will be placed before the General Body for necessary directions and action. Further, the house congratulated Shri Sanjay K Chadha for handling the court cases with precision and the house unanimously condemned the action of the miscreants who are trying to sabotage Olympiad as well as progress of AICF which not only against office bearers but also against chess in the country when the game is taking centre stage.

Further the house also urged, Tamil Nadu State Chess Association to withdrew the case against All India Chess Federation, Calicut vide C.S No. 396 of 2007 and High Court Arbitration C.S. NO. 835 of 2012 before the Hon'ble Madras High Court as the entity agreed to transfer all the funds to All India Chess Federation which will boost the finances of the Federation and chess community in particular as the amount is lying redundant in the bank account of All India Chess Federation Calicut. In reply, acting secretary of TNSCA Shri Hariharan intimated the house that after consulting with President of TNSCA will do the needful.

AGENDA 15: Ratification of decision of President for exemption to India's Number 1 Women player Koneru Humpy for Olympiad team selection

Decision:

The decision of President for granting exemption to India's Number 1 Women Player Koneru Humpy from stipulated 9 games in six months for Olympiad team selection ratified by the house.

AGENDA 16: Ratification of decision of creation of Website, Registration, Accreditation and Ticketing Portal for 44th FIDE Chess Olympiad.

Decision:.

The house unanimously ratified the decision of granting the contract to M/S Tinycode Technologies Pvt Ltd for creation of website, registration, accreditation and ticketing portal of Olympiad as the same was in urgent nature due to FIDE deadlines associated with hosting 44th FIDE Chess Olympiad. The details have also been forwarded to the Tender Committee.

(a) Proposal of AICF Arbiters' Commission

The proposal of AICF Arbiters' Commission was circulated amongst the members and Chairman Arbiters' Commission Shri Dharmendra Kumar explained the necessity of increasing the remuneration of Arbiters and Lecturers for National Championships, International Championships and Seminars considering the inflation and last revision was done in the year 2017. After due deliberations, the house unanimously decided to accept the proposal and change the Financial Regulations of Federation accordingly. Chairman Arbiters Commission, extended his gratitude to the house for considering the same favourably.

- (b) The President intimated the house that chess is growing thick and fast than expected and proposed to have a bigger office in Delhi with conference hall, separate cubicle office for office bearers and staffs envisaging to accommodate more staff. The house unanimously agreed for the President's proposal considering the growing stature of AICF and approved additional funds of Rs. 4.00 crore for this excluding registration charges. The house also authorised the 5 members Tender Committee to monitor the same.
- (c) The President intimated that advertising of any event especially Olympiad is of utmost importance and AICF is likely to receive Rs. 80 lakh from the registration of extra persons of Olympiad and seeks permission from the house to spend the amount on advertisement of Olympiad. The house approved the proposal of President.
- (d) The President intimated that the stature of AICF is growing many fold and we are losing huge amount of money for movement of people and proposed to have a SUV for the Federation for routine work of AICF which will help the Federation to save amount on transportation requirement. The house unanimously agreed for the proposal and authorised Secretary to Purchase a SUV.
- (e) The Secretary proposed that Chess Olympiad is a life time opportunity for many of us and all the States Presidents and Secretaries of the State Associations must be invited to witness the Olympiad as well as a welcome kit to be extended to all the President, Secretaries and AICF office bearers as well as 1 Blazer and Olympiad Memento. He also welcomed all the State Presidents, Secretaries and office bearers for the Olympiad Torch Launch Ceremony on 19th June 22 at New Delhi. The house approved the proposal and thanked Secretary for his great gesture.
- (f) The house unanimously agreed to support the candidature of Grandmaster Viswanathan Anand for the FIDE Deputy President's post and

also nominated Secretary Bharat Singh Chauhan as Delegate for the FIDE Congress.

- (g) The house congratulated and applauded the swift action taken by the Secretary of All India Chess Federation Shri Bharat Singh Chauhan for successfully bringing the chess spectacle of Olympiad in short notice. The house unanimously extended its gratitude to the Government of Tamil Nadu and Government of India for the overwhelming support for the Olympiad enabling the AICF to hold the event in a short span of time.
- (h) Shri Ranjan Mohanty, Joint Secretary & Shri Naresh Sharma-Treasurer proposed that Mr. Bharat Singh Chauhan must be honoured and felicitated during closing ceremony of 44th FIDE Chess Olympiad for bringing the chess Olympiad to Indian soil first time ever as well as ensuring the record number of participating countries in just two months' time. The house unanimously supported the proposal and passed the resolution to request Tamil Nadu Government to include such a felicitation and Mr. Bharat Singh's address in the closing ceremony of the Olympiad for his mammoth efforts.
- (I) Shri Naresh Sharma-Treasurer AICF told that Mr. Ravindra Dongre who is a member of the Ethics Commission of FIDE tried his level best to sabotage the Olympiad by filing court cases. This unethical behaviour of a person who is a member of Ethics Commission is condemnable. He proposed that the house should pass a VOTE OF CENSURE (NINDA PRASTAV) against Mr. Ravindra Dongre and should also lodge a formal complaint with FIDE. Complete house passed this resolution unanimously.

Dear Friends,

I am pleased and privileged to present the Annual Report of our Federation for the year 2022 - 2023 to this august body.

First time in history, India Men and Women in the 2[∞] rank among in the FIDE ranking list of all the 200 affiliated Federations with FIDE during March 2023.

It is a matter of pride for all of us that despite lack of serious training, our players have performed creditably and won medals in the International Championships.

There were some more spectacular performances by our players both at the Asian and World forums. The Federation was very active and a record 379 tournaments were rated by the FIDE of which 20 were International open tournaments, 71 National Championships and 288 were rated tournaments.



Special mention and congratulations should be made to most talented Chess players WGM Bhakti Kulkarni and GM Rameshbabu Praggnanandhaa who received Arjuna Award from Hon'ble President of India, Smt Droupadi Murmu ji.

I am happy to share that with overwhelming support from the Government of India and Government of Tamil Nadu we hosted the 44° Chess Olympiad at Mahabalipuram from 28 July to 10 August 2022. A total number of 186 countries participated in

this prestigious event and created history. It is praiseworthy to mention that with the support of all stakeholders and state associations we put up great organizing skills to hold the event within a span of five months. FIDE as well as all the participating federations

months. FIDE as well as all the participating federations were delighted with the arrangements and congratulated our Federation for the remarkable spirit.

We extend our sincere thanks to Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, Hon'ble Union Sports Minister Shri Anurag Thakur and Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu Thiru







M K Stalin for their blessings and support for making the Olympiad a great success. We also place on record our sincere gratitude to all the officials of Ministry of External Affairs, Ministry of Home Affairs, Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports and Government of Tamil Nadu for their support for making the event memorable one for all. We also extend our gratitude to Shri Bharat Singh Chauhan, the Tournament Director of the





Olympiad for his untiring work and vision for the remarkable achievement in the Indian chess history.

Uzbekistan and Ukraine clinched top position in Open and Women's section respectively in the Olympiad while the young Indian team performed exceedingly well to finish at third position in Open section while our Women team also finished as second runner-up. The performance earned us the overall Gaprindashvili Cup. Grandmasters D Gukesh and Nihal Sarin secured Board Prize Gold Medals

while Arjun Erigaisi got the silver. Praggnanandhaa R, Vaishali R, Tania Sachdev and Divya Deshmukh added board prize bronze medals to the Indian performance in the event.



'World Chess Day' was celebrated with the unveiling of the official stamp of the 44th FIDE Chess Olympiad 2022 at New Delhi.

Along with the Olympiad, 93⁻⁻ FIDE Congress also took place and incumbent President Mr.

Arkady Dvorkovich was re-elected as FIDE President while legendary Indian Grandmaster Viswanathan Anand was elected as FIDE Deputy President.

In the administrative side also, it was a fruitful year for India as Shri Bharat Singh Chauhan has been nominated as the Chairman of FIDE Advisory Board while several our officials were

nominated to the FIDE Commissions as Councilors and Members.





Asian Chess Excellence Awards 2023

India showed its supremacy in the Asian continent by bagging many notable awards in the Asian Chess Excellence Awards 2023 organised by Asian Chess Federation. Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu Thiru M K Stalin was adjudged as Man of the Year for his outstanding contribution for the successful hosting of 44 World Chess Olympiad while D





Gukesh became Player of the year and AICF bagged the Most Active Federation award once again. The Indian Women team consisting of Koneru Humpy, Dronavalli Harika, R Vaishali, Tania Sachdev and Bhakti Kulkarni secured Best Women's team of the year. GM RB Ramesh — Coach of the Year, GM Abhijit Kunte — Women's Coach of the year, GM Leon Luke Mendonca — Best Junior Player and Ilamparthi A R — Best Youth Player are the other awardees.

National Championships:

All the National Championships were held as planned and the players were selected to represent India on the basis of their performances in these championships. As a result of all these, we have as on 31.03.2023, 80 Grandmasters, 135 International Masters, 13 Women Grandmasters (including GMs, IMs and FMs), 45 Women International Masters, 113 FIDE Masters, 50 Women FIDE Masters, 77 Candidate Masters, 28 Woman Candidate Masters, 08 FIDE Senior Trainers, 54 FIDE Trainers, 231 FIDE Instructors, 153 Developmental Instructors and 257 National Instructors.

The All India Chess Federation has been practicing a unique system of organising all our National Championships one year ahead of the corresponding Asian / World Championships. Therefore our players are selected one year ahead of the championship and have ample time to prepare themselves for the Asian and World Championship matches. Since all the National Championships were held and the players were identified to represent the country one year in advance, we were able to prepare well and the results are there for everybody to see.

To sustain the above momentum it was important to equip ourselves with more technical and field officials. We took efforts in substantially increasing the technical force which is very important to carry on the activities of the Federation to the next level. We have now increased the strength of our technical team to 199 International Arbiters and 357 FIDE Arbiters.

Once again, the All India Chess Federation proved that it is second to none in hosting / organizing International mega events like 44 FIDE Chess Olympiad at Chennai, from 29th





July to 9th August, 2022 and Asian Continental Chess Championship held at New Delhi from 25th October to 04th November 2022. Also, we organized a record breaking 11 Open Grandmasters tournaments during the year with resounding success.

The members may be pleased to know that as many as 379 tournaments were rated by the FIDE out of which 288 tournaments were FIDE rated tournaments, the rest being National Championships and other International events. Delhi GM Open at Delhi, Guwahati GM Open at Assam, Gujarat GM Open at Gujarat, KIIT Chess Festival at Odisha, Chennai GM Open at Chennai, Maharashtra GM Open at Maharashtra, Vizag GM Open at Vizag, Athens of the East GM Open at Madurai, Chhattisgarh GM Open at Raipur, Bikaner GM Open at Rajasthan and Tata Steel International Rapid & Blitz tournament at Kolkata were international Grandmaster tournaments organized making it possible for our players to get FIDE title norms and high quality tournament exposure.

Our Federation has progressed on the digital front with online registration of players and also registration of entries for all National Championships. We have also revamped our website to suit the needs of our growing activities. We have conducted free trainer and arbiter seminars during the year with the support of Sports Authority of India. All these things have resulted in some spectacular performances by our players who continued the exemplary legacy that has been established, especially from 2005, and have made us proud by their outstanding performances both at the Asian and World forums. Thanks to the organization of numerous tournaments, the chess players benefited immensely by way of prize money to the tune of Rs.11,80,67,350/- of these, Rs.6,12,00,350/- were given as prize money in all the rating tournaments put together, Rs.2,69,58,000/- was given as prize money in all International GM Open Chess tournaments.

The All India Chess Federation is working towards making India one of the strong chess playing Nations. From 1950 when the game was officially started (though AICF was registered in 1958) till 2005 India had produced only 10 Grandmasters. Due to the sustained efforts of all the stakeholders and putting in measures to organize many FIDE title norm tournaments, India in the last decade had produced 70 more Grandmasters. Thanks to the continued support of the SAI / MYAS we were able to provide our players with all possible foreign exposure and also give them intensive coaching under eminent and renowned chess trainers.

On the financial front, AICF has been utilizing the funds properly and as a result the funds position looks comfortable which will help us to increase our chess development programs without any financial constraints.

The Federation fulfilled all the requirements under our Constitution and Bye laws and have filed our annual documents with statutory authorities like the Registrar of Societies, Tamilnadu, the Income Tax authorities and also with the Government of India. We had conducted 4 Central Council meetings and one Annual General Body Meeting as prescribed under the Constitution.

Asian Youth Chess Championships 2022 at Bali-Indonesia from 13th to 22th October 2022



secure Gold medal in all three formats of Under-10 Open category. He also remained undefeated in all 23 games. Charvi A, Ethan Vaz, Saparya Ghosh and WFM Bhagyashree Patil added two Gold medals each in their respective categories.



NOTES ON ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31.03.2023

1. Significant Accounting Policies

- The Financial statements of the Association are prepared in accordance with theGenerally Accepted Accounting Principles in India.
- b. The Accounting Policies adopted in preparation of financial statements are consistent with those followed in the previous year.
- c. Revenue is recognized based on nature of activity when revenue can be reasonably measured and there exists reasonable certainty of its recovery. Interest income on Fixed deposits is accounted as per statements furnished by the Banks. Other revenue is accounted net of related expenses.
- d. Government grants towards conduct of national and international tournaments and exposure of Indian players in foreign countries are recognized as income on realization.
- e. Fixed Assets are carried at cost less depreciation. The cost of fixed asset comprises of its purchase price net of trade discounts and rebates.
- f. Depreciation has been provided on WDV method and at the rates under the Income Tax Act.
- g. Impairment of assets is recognized based on yearly review.
- h. Foreign exchange transactions are recognized at the rates prevalent on the date of transaction. Loss/profit is recognized at the time of actual realization. Monetary items of assets and liabilities at the end of the year are stated at the rates prevalent on the closing date.
- i. Contingent liabilities are not recognized and disclosed.
- j. Income & Expenditure account & the Statement of affairs prepared as on 31.03.2023 represent transactions that have taken place during the year 2022-23. Income &Expenditure do not include air tickets provided by the Government directly to the players.
